SUSPECTED SPY, AREO STUDENT, HELD IN ITHACA

Youth in Training at Cornell
Aviation School Under
Military Guard

HAS A GERMAN NAME

Further Information Withheld
Concerning Alleged Arrest
of Man in Uniform

VISITED CHAIN WORKS

Said to Have Been Caught
Near Plant Making Motors
for Airplanes

ITHACA, Jan. 15.—One of the students in training at the United States Ground Aviation School in the new Cornell drill hall is under military guard suspected of being a German spy. The military authorities refuse all information on the subject.

The student, who is said to possess a German name, entered the school three weeks ago. Wherever he goes he is accompanied by a military guard. He is allowed to go to Beebe Lake to skate but his guard, armed with .44 Colts, skates with him. He is also permitted to visit the business section of the city, to make purchases but is never permitted to part company with his military escort.

It is rumored that the young man was caught near the Morse Chain Works, which is engaged in making airplane motors for the Thomas Aeroplane Company of Ithaca.

It is understood that the suspect is being held pending orders from Washington but no information of a definite character can be obtained from the military authorities.

The youth wore the regulation uniform and entered as a student to learn the technical end of the air game before becoming a pilot.
