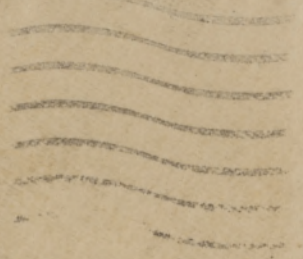
Betsy darling:-
