The Clarence H. White School of Photography - our School - has been given up. It could not be made to pay expenses. After completing the best year of its history its books could have been made to balance only by charging off the services of Mr. White himself. This was too great a sacrifice for the School to ask even of Mr. White, who in his lavish and self-forgetful way has given it all he had, and, as Mr. White had to have something to live on, part of the rent due to the Realty Corporation was not paid. The Directors therefore, acting in the interest of the stockholders were obliged to take over the property.

The School House is to be sold, but before it is, it would like to welcome the Alumni again.

Please take notice therefore that there will be a meeting of the Alumni of the Clarence H. White School of Photography on Friday evening, October 13th at 8:15. You will find that the Alumni Exhibition of 1922, which will be on the walls of the exhibition room until after the meeting, will be worth seeing. There will be other interesting and important items. Besides, Mr. White wants to see you.
