Dear Miss Gilpin: -

In reference to my letter of June 5th I hasten to advise you that I have just heard from Mr. Sherer of the St. Louis City Museum and that he has stated that two prints instead of one, as I first thought, were sold there.

As you letter of April 24th advised me that fifty six prints had been shipped to St. Louis and two prints had been sold there, the fifty four returned to you make the checkup correct.

The error on our part in checking was, no doubt, due to the double mounting and we again counted fifty five on the recount. We knew very well, when again checking up, before hanging your set, and only finding fifty-four present, after three counts had been made that the print could not have been mislaid since your folder went immediately into a safe when received and from the dafe on to the walls and so hung as to have made noticeable any print removed. It was annoying to feel that there might have been one taken and I can assure you our relief was great when Mr. Sherer's letter arrived.

Mr. Sherer states that N. 43 Gateway, Garden of the Gods and 53, In the Mountains, were sold. We found No. 43 missing and No. 31 missing, (In Estes Park). but No. 43 present.

Regretting our error and assuring you that had we lost any prints you would have been fully reimbursed for them, I am
