
"Camera Pictures" published by the Alumni praised by Mr. Laurvick, Director of San Francisco Museum in the last Alumni letter and more recently highly complimented by P. H. Emerson of England, one of the first authorities on Pictorial Photography, has not yet been paid for. The printer, Mr. Lewis F. White, is not able to carry this account. There is some \$250 still due him. The Association obliges the Treasurer to keep a balance of \$100. I am therefore appealing to you for a loan to the Alumni Association so this can be paid. I will assume the responsibility of disposing of the copies not yet sold and repaying the loan to the Association.

The publication was a responsibility assumed by the Alumni and the work is of inestimable value to photography and probably the most needed activity in America today. I am sorry it has proven the same hard job to the Association as it has been to all who have undertaken such an activity here. As was stated in the last letter if members of the Alumni will buy one copy at \$1.00 in addition to the one given them with their membership, the portfolio is paid for.

I am retaining 60 copies for advertising the school, taking 5 each month for which I will pay \$1.00 per copy but the school cannot advance \$60 for advertising.
