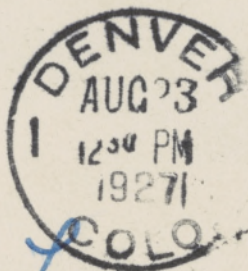
Dear Laura:
