As to the prints, I believe that the silver prints will answer our purpose. We have your picture of the altar and reredos, which you say is platinum, framed and hung in our office, and when the others are received we can very easily compare them with that.

We have other things to send of course, but shall hold them until your glossy prints arrive. By the way, your glossy prints need not be mounted.

It is needless to say that I should like to hear Mr. Boothroyd perform, and if I lived in Colorado Springs I would stop at the church often for the afternoon recitals.
