My dear Miss Gilpin:

We are all interested in seeing the result of your efforts to photograph Grace Church after a snowstorm, and in some ways we are pleased with these results. The effect of the snow lodging on crockets, battlements, window sills and string courses is very interesting, but it is unfortunate that the very ungainly trees in the foreground have to show so conspicuously in the pictures. This is one disadvantage of photographing in the winter time, when the trees are bare of foliage, especially if the trunks and branches do not happen to be things of beauty in themselves.

In one of the pictures it is particularly unfortunate to have the snow-laden branch come just in front of the belfry windows. I think the snow on the ground and on the building itself adds an interesting feature to the pictures but I do not think the snow on the trees adds anything to their beauty.

The picture of the interior of the chapel is very nice indeed. It is the first one I have seen with the new chairs in place. This picture may be included among those that we wish to have, but I have a feeling that the exterior will look better if taken after the snow has gone. Very likely you will think so too, and probably by this time have taken other pictures.

The organ cases are probably in place by this time, and if so, you will be able to send us some more pictures of the interior.
