Dear Miss Gilpin:

The second package of photographs has been received, and they have been much admired. The one of the exterior of the church is particularly good as exteriors of this church go. There does not seem to be a mark of identification on the pictures, either on the back or front, but possibly I can tell you the ones we would like to have finished in silver, printed on 11 x 14 stock, at \$5. each, in accordance with your letter of March sixth. We should like to keep all of the prints you have already sent to us. These, we understand, are \$1.50 each.

Those that we would like to have printed in silver are:-

1. The exterior from the north-west (The one with the wooden fence and gate in the immediate foreground).
2. The interior of the side chapel looking full at the reredos.
3. The interior of the side chapel looking through the arch at the main altar and reredos, with window above.
4. The general view of the interior from about half way down the nave.
5. The view of the chancel taken slightly closer.
6. The view of the chancel which shows the altar and reredos in still larger proportions.

Is this all perfectly clear to you?

Perhaps later on you will be able to get other views of the exterior, perhaps one from the north or slightly north-west, showing the parish house in steep perspective, and giving practically a side view of the church. The prints you have already sent us will do very well for reproduction in the book which I mentioned in a previous letter.
