Dear Mr. Klauder:

Your letter of November 15 has been received regarding the photographs of Mayo Hall at the University of Denver. I should be very glad to make any photographs for you that you wish. I always work with 8"x 10" plates and I will speak to Mr. Fisher regarding these tomorrow as I am going to Denver then. I have already made one interior of the "Little Theatre" for the University and as we have already had two snow storms I am afraid it is too late for outdoor things, unless you wish something in the snow which often may be attractively done.

Regarding the negatives, I never sell a negative outright, except in very unusual circumstances. It is seldom that another person would make a print of the same character as my own and from the legal point of view the negative is always the property of the photographer. It will always be possible to reach me for any further prints that you should desire and my price on a negative complete

would be considerable higher than the individual prints.

For the past three years I have been doing all the work for Fisher & Fisher of Denver and I am very much interested in doing architectural work. If you are not in a great hurry for these photographs I believe it would be better to wait until spring as there are many attractive points of view around the building which include foliage. However, I am sure I can find something satisfactory at the present time if you desire.
