LUNCHEONS: The City Club is addressed concerning some municipal subject at a weekly Luncheon at the Adams Hotel.

COMMITTEES: One hundred and fifty men are serving on Committees, each man having volunteered for this service. Each Committee holds a luncheon every two weeks.

MEMBERSHIP: The membership is limited to 500. Every reputable man who desires to take an interest in civic affairs is invited to file his application with the membership director.

PURPOSE: To insist upon the importance of public affairs; to ascertain conditions; to impart, not opinions, but the basis for opinions; to discipline acts with private thinking; to co-operate with public officials in seeking to improve conditions susceptible of improvement; and only as a last resort to publish criticism; to kill germs of iniquity and neglect with the light of truth, to seek to inform rather than to reform; not to take sides in public issues, but to equip individuals to do so effectively; to foster good-humored friendship among ourselves; all to the end that in Denver, public administration, commerce, the arts and the sciences may thrive.
