If you happen to be going through Alamosa do not forget to photograph the high school for us. I think the front elevation and the auditorium are about all that are worth while. This job was simply rebuilding what they had, adding a little to the front, and had to be done very cheaply.

We built three booster stations for the A. T. & T. Co., one at Holbrook and one at Kingman, Arizona, and one at Milford, Utah. I do not suppose you will be going through any of these towns but if you should at any time we are very anxious to have them photographed probably one photograph of the exterior and one interior showing all the complicated equipment of one of them, as the interiors are all identical in the three buildings.
