However I think I see two comparatively free weeks ahead and I hope to have the prints in shape to show by the end of that time.

I saw Dr. Morley for only a moment in Yucatan as he was leaving for his expedition to Campeche the very day that we arrived, and he did not return until sometime after we had left. I was planning to show him the print in Santa Fe where he will be before long I am sure.

I hope that you will all find at least some of my prints to your liking. I was quite thrilled with the ruins and endeavored to the utmost of my ability to interpret them.

Under separate cover I am mailing you a folder regarding a series of lantern slides of the Southwest that I am at the moment producing. I hope that sometime you may see these. And I hope to produce a set of Chichen. This however, will be somewhat in the future as it will mean another trip to complete my series. I went down with the group from the Fountain Valley School and our time was limited. Is not your nephew at this school?

I assure you that the Carnegie Institute will be the first to see my Chichen prints and I am hoping that I will have them completed in the very near future.
