Under separate cover I am mailing you several prints. I have delayed in sending these in order that I might obtain a new negative of the Chancel. I had to wait for this as there has been some experimenting going on regarding the radio, and there were wires in the way. I am sending you two prints, one from the first negative and one from the new one. Keep which ever you prefer and sometime when you are coming up you can bring the other one back.

As I quoted you when we first discussed the photographs my prices are \$5.00 on the first print, either glossy or mat, and \$3.50 on duplicate mat prints, glossy \$2.00. As it seems a poor economy to pay \$5.00 for the first print and have that a glossy print, I have made these in the mounted mat prints, and send the glossy prints in addition. These prices were for the original size, the enlargements to be additional.

As soon as conditions are right I will proceed with the remaining photographs and send you proofs

of them. The best time for the exteriors will be just as the leaves are coming out, and as soon as the other windows are in, I will do the interiors.

I am going to be away again for about four weeks. I have the exciting and unexpected opportunity for a trip to Yucatan to photograph the Mayan Ruins. We leave next Sunday and return about April 25th.
