Your letter with the enclosures came this morning, and the corrections will be underway at once.

Regarding the printing of twenty copies and holding the balance, this would add considerably to the cost as the press would have to be made ready for the job twice and a press could not be held for the time it would take to send anything out of town. I will send you a corrected final proof, paged, which will amount to the same thing except that it will be on the right stock, nor will it be bound, but the type will be ready for any final corrections.

I call your attention to a correction I find in the PP on Graduation. The "s" of student is marked removed. This would necessitate a rearrangement of tenses in the sentence. Should it not read thus with this change "The school requires that the student has spent at least two years at Los Alamos, holds the rank of First Class Scout, and has shown etc...."

I notice also some new changes in copy. You understand ofcourse that this will make a slight addition to the cost of the job as in each case it requires the re-setting of the entire paragraph.

A final prcof will be mailed at the earliest possible moment.
