Dear Dr. Moe:

Here is the Lecture which is to accompany the lantern slides. It is not yet in its final form owing to various changes I have made in the arrangement of the slides at a comparatively recent date. I began by having the slides in geographic sequence, then when I was able to get the Morris Cave in September I decided to change to a time sequence which is the better and a more logical arrangement, I am sure.

I have had considerable difficulty in getting sufficient information from the various archaeologists to have this complete and printed at this time, but I think it is in presentable shape for you. I feel that this text still needs some polishing before it goes to the printer.
