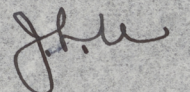
For the past several weeks we have enjoyed the privilege of exhibiting a superb group of forty-eight photographic studies by Miss Laura Gilpin of Colorado Springs, of the great Mayan ruins of Chichen-Itza, Yucatan, where Dr. Morley, of Carnegie Institution, has been conducting excavations for many years. These studies cover all the major ruins and features, as well as details of altars, columns, entrances, and of modern Mayan Indians. Possibly, if request were made, Miss Gilpin would be happy to have you exhibit these photographic prints at the time of the opening, if such an exhibit would fit into your general plan. We are taking them down very shortly, so they will be available for display elsewhere.

Dr. Morley makes his headquarters here at the Laboratory, with members of his staff, for about six months each year, that is during the rainy season in Yucatan.

I could not reach Dr. Renaud before his departure, but believe that he would heartily approve of such an exhibit.
