I cannot understand why my prints should have failed to reach you on time for the Exhibition as they were shipped more than three weeks before hand.

It has been owing to the strenuous times of earning a livelihood by photography that has prevented my sending work to your exhibition for the past two years, for prior to that, I believe that I have not missed a year since my first entry in 1917, or 1918.
