My dear Mr. Putnam:-

There seems to be some misunderstanding at the American Museum of Natural History regarding the number of photographs of mine which they received.

Did you receive the three portfolios containing ninety four prints is all, fifty seven of Yucatan and thirty seven Southwest prints?

Dr. Fisher sent me a copy of his letter to you which I answered at once as his figure of "63" was incorrect. He has just written that they had checked very carefully and that they had never received but sixty three and has shipped sixty three to you. According to Brenda's very careful description of the exhibition in New York there were ninety two on the walls at the Museum.

This is doubtless an error on the part of the individual who unpacked and repacked the prints. My present concern is to know that we have the full number in Washington, for I should be distressed if a whole group of the ten prints were omitted.
