Dear Miss Gilpin:

My ideas are becoming a little clearer about the album on which you are working for me.

In the first place, it seems to me that it should be definitely a loose-leaf album, so that other leaves can be inserted in later years. Another point that I have in mind is that under each photograph there should be enough space to write quite a bit of information about some of the persons photographed. The leaves, as I remember it, are to be white or nearly white.

My thought is that as soon as you are ready you will go ahead and make the prints of the pictures that you have from Mrs. Stewart's album — in accordance with the list which I sent you sometime ago. This could be done to advantage, I take it, pending my sending you the other photographs not contained in the list I mailed you and which I wrote you might number 10 or 12 but which I now think will total at least 18 or 20. A few of them will need to be reduced in size. I do not remember whether the pictures in Mrs. Stewart's album all are of uniform size. Do you consider it an advantage to have them so, or would you

It is my idea that, when you get these loose-leaf pages completed, we can figure out what kind of cover to put on them. I shall be very glad to have any suggestions you may be willing to make.
