However, I think it is better for Mrs. Stewart to have these albums made, as she will include the Stewart family; so please cut the number I planned to have made from 14 to 10. This will apply to all the prints you make for me, unless later on I should want more copies of individual prints.

Of course, I shall want 10 copies of each of the photographs which I am to send you -- photographs additional to those which you duplicated for me from Mrs. Stewart's album, according to the list which I furnished you. To this list of photographs from her album please add: W. Pyncheon, founder of Springfield, Massachusetts; Charles Chauncey, president of Harvard; and Ruth Hall Hart, sister of Burnham Hall.

Respecting the sample of "Charing" paper, it will be satisfactory to use that paper, unless for some reason you ultimately decide that, every-
