Regarding the handling of the longer articles to accompany photographs in my album, it would help materially if in some cases we could push the photograph up to within an inch and a half or two inches of the top of the page. In some instances, how would it do to place the photograph toward the side of the page, say within an inch and a half, and the same distance from the top, using the space to the left of the photograph and the space underneath it for the reading matter where the article is longer? Such a plan would cut down the number of extra pages which would be required if the articles were to run over onto the next page.

As I understand your plan for two volumes, you would have volume one take in members of the Cowles family, down to and including my father and his generation. Similarly, volume one would take in the Hutchinson family, down to and including my mother; and the Cheney family, down to and including the parents of my wife.
