I have put the source of the Reverend Thomas Hooker article under his name heading -- to be part of the caption. Of course, his name should be in the regular large caption type.

✓ Regarding the caption under the photograph of the statue of Richard Hooker, album page 7, please substitute the enclosed corrected caption slip for the one sent you previously.

✓ I should like to include in my album the photograph of Judge Alfred Cowles which you sent me August 5. I know of no other Cowles who lived to be over 100 years. ^{born Nov 4, 1752,} ^{and of Dr. Edwin Weed Cowles} Ezekiel Cowles was a common ancestor of Judge Cowles, and of Alfred Cowles, publisher of the Chicago Tribune. Perhaps Mrs. Stewart would want to add these facts to the information she already has about Judge Cowles. The photograph, which I have numbered 2005, should go, along with the caption, right after album page 19 on Dr. Edwin Weed Cowles. Please follow Mrs. Stewart's wording for the caption under Judge Cowles' photograph.
