You will recall that several years ago you bound two volumes of photographs for me for my clients, Mr. and Mrs. Philip B. Stewart. At the present moment I am working on three duplicate sets for Mr. and Mrs. Stewart, and they have asked me to write to you regarding a simpler and less expensive binding; perhaps something in cloth with some simple lettering. Would you send me any suggestions you may have, with prices?
