Dear Mr. Eschmann:-

At long last the Cowles job is nearly ready for you. I am expecting to ship the completed assembled pages for Volume One to you not later than Monday December 2nd. If I possibly can get them off Saturday, I will. If you will proceed with the loose leaf bindings as per our previous communications, the material for Volume Two will follow very shortly. There will be 70 pages at present in Volume Two. I imagine that you can proceed with the covers for this volume so that you can quickly add the pages to them when you receive them. If it is at all possible I should like to deliver these for Christmas. Somewhat depends on receiving last corrections for the printing to go in Volume Two. The photographs for this volume are practically all done so that mounting is all that there will have to be done, though this is no small task as you will see when you receive the material.

I expect an answer from Mr. Cowles in a few days regarding a container for the volumes and will let you know at once which one he prefers.

In printing all the pages for these volumes I have done one extra page for emergency. I believe that I shall have an extra set, and as I have many extra pictures, I should like to have one copy of Volume One for myself as a sample for show to obtain further work. I may not get the pictures mounted, but I will send you the pages. Just the one copy of Volume One is all that I want and a similar binding to Mr. Cowles' without a container. I believe that this would be very good advertising for future work.

The Title for the Covers is enclosed herewith and I have already sent you the sample of material which Mr. Cowles selected.
