I shall want quite a quantity, sufficient to make 600 pages size 12x14 of what ever the final selection will be.

Enclosed please find a sample of paper which was used the the Platinotype Co., of London for platinum photographic paper. I should like to find something similar for the same purpose coating the paper here. This has a hard surface which holds the image on the surface. The enclosed sample has been in developer and wash water and still retains this surface. Any information you can give me about such a paper will be greatly appreciated.

Will you also send me samples of hard surfaced American made all rag papers which might be used for this same purpose. I have quite an order for hand coated platitudes and am anxious to have the final decisions regarding the papers reached. It is several years since I have sent you an order, and I trust that you are still in business and able to furnish the above requests.
