Here are seventeen prints. The fifteen on your list and in addition a detail of the Temple of the Warriors and a second print of the castillo from the Temple of the Warriors. I found that I was not certain which of two might have been with the prints you selected from so I am sending both. The detail of the Warriors I felt was needed in this group. You may sue it or not as you see fit. I did not realize there were so few of the Warriors in the group that were sent quite hurriedly to Mr. Frank Mechau at Columbia. As there are 52 prints in my entire set, there are of course a number of details of the Warriors that are important in relation to a series of that building.

I am hoping that in the not too distant future, the entire set can be published in book form. I have been hoping ever since I was down there that I could get back to complete the set, but so far I have not been able to do so. That is why I have not made an effort before this to have the entire lot published. There are many details I did not get, and certain buildings were in process of reconstruction so that I was unable to do them. If all goes well this year, I hope to be able to complete the series.
