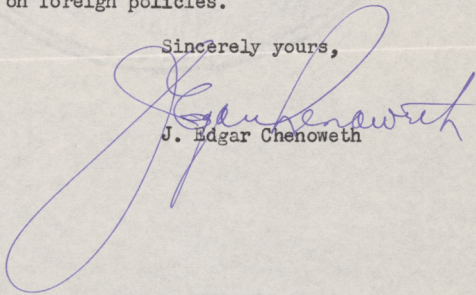
Dear Miss Gilpin:
