Dear Mr. Brown:-

I was very glad indeed to hear from you regarding the La Placita cards. I have been hoping to get down all summer to see you or some one in charge regarding them. I undertook the making of these cards for Mr. Weir in 1939 and on August 28 of that year sent him \$50. worth of the six different subjects. So far I have only been able to collect \$5.00 on this account. The large balance of the cards I was to deliver every few months, there were 1000 of each printed. As the whole job stands now I am out \$150. on the job of making the originals and this large order of printed cards.

I am very anxious to make some disposal of them. The wholesale price on all my cards is ~~33¢~~, retail 5¢, or in sets of six cards, 12~~¢~~ per set, retail 25¢. I can send you what ever you need immediately or make you a special price to take the whole lot which I should like to do, as I may be moving and the cards are heavy and take up much room.

I shall be glad to hear from you further and trust that we can make some arrangement on the whole order. Can you tell me if Mr. Weir is still in Albuquerque?
