Dear Mr. Eschmann:-

At long last after months of waiting the Stewart books are off to you by express to-day. There are two packages containing the material for the three sets of books with two volumes each. You will find them wrapped in sections so that the pages would carry to the best advantage, each Volume being packed in two packages. All the pages are numbered in the binding corner and have all been carefully checked for order. However, I have kept a dummy here, so that if any question should occur I can refer to it here.

I have before me your letter of September 18, 1941, when you quoted me prices on the binding of these volumes.

"6 Volumes bound in Domestic Morocco, gold tooled, panel of front cover with title, silk lined inside per vol. \$26.00"

"1 Volume same binding as original Volumes French Levant \$60.00"

The packages being shipped to you to-day contain only the 6 Volumes for the binding in Domestic Morocco. The 1 Volume to be bound in the French Levant will follow in a short time. An Index is being lettered for it and as soon as that comes, I shall send it on.

I wrote to you on Sept. 20th of last year to hold the French Levant leather which I surely hope you have done. The material selected for the 6 Volumes was a dark blue domestic, the sample of which I returned to you some months ago. You would also a lot of the packages for the binding, and also the original Stewart Books. When you finish for this set you will have to make a three Volumes.

The three Volumes also include 3 boxes for the three sets which you quoted me at \$8.

This order will duplicate two volumes in the box. The cost of covers as finally were completed a short time

before McKissack went into the army. They cannot compare with the beautiful work done by Miss Hulbert, but it seems to be the best we could obtain, that is at a reasonable cost.

Trusting that you have on file all the necessary information and that the material for this work is in your hands and that it may go ahead in reasonable time, I am
