Dear Mr. Morgan:-

I am a day late in getting this back to you but it arrived at a moment when I was in deep for some work that had to gotten out.

I find only two typographical errors: the first under the heading Line and Tone. There is an added word here that does not make sense, so that the word "or" in line five under this heading must be deleted. Under Historic Background the first sub-heading is misspelled. On galley 9 the heading "Mayan" has been placed a paragraph too soon. The reference is definately to the Southwest, and the Mayan heading should come at the next paragraph. I am sure this will be clear when you read it again. I notice that you have made a few omissions which are O.K. with the exception of one. This is the last paragraph in my Ms. which begins "Far to the South in Old Mexico". It would be all right to leave this out were it not for a reference preceeding it. I believe the best way to correct this would be a change above. I suggest the following:-

"The landscape in which the ruins at Chichen Itza are located is uninteresting." As it stands it refers to the whole Mayan civilization and I undertand that some of the other sections are in much more interesting and very different country.

I trust that every thing is clearly indicated and these slight corrections can be made without too iteration.
