Dear Miss Gilpin:

We have contacted Private Winston regarding possession of your premises and regarding the money he owes you. The best solution in this seems to be for him to voluntarily vacate the place, which he has agreed to do by the 19th of April. He is to leave your equipment intact in the shop.

Due to the fact that he is a soldier, it would be very difficult to secure the money he owes you by any legal proceedings. However, we have contacted his commanding officer, with fairly satisfactory results.

According to this officer, Winston is leaving here April 19th, and will go to Hollywood to make a "Movie Short" for Paramount. Out of the proceeds of this he will supposedly clean up his debts.

There is no guarantee that he will pay the debts, but the agreement to do so, backed by his commanding officer, seems to be satisfactory, in as much as a judgment against Winston would be absolutely no good.

We will notify you immediately when the shop is vacated, and at the same time we will ask F. C. Acker to check the equipment.
