Dear Miss Gilpin:

At last the six photo albums and boxes are on the way to Mrs. Stewart in Colorado Springs.

I hope that you will find everything in order. The leather was just a little lighter in color than the sample was, our domestic tanners are not too particular when it comes to color. However, it is a very nice blue. I interleaved every page with the oriental paper. This paper is difficult to get at the present time. I had just enough on hand for this job and also for Volume III. The Volume III is not ready yet. I will get that done as soon as possible. I am enclosing the bill as quoted on September 1941, plus 10% due to the fact that prices and labor has gone up considerably between September 1941 and November 1942 the time when the books arrived for binding. I also add the interleaving with Oriental paper, this request came in after the quotation was submitted.

I am not doing much of this type of work at the present time as we only accept essential work now, but I am being kept busy by the Army. They moved a rare collection of medical books to Cleveland from Washington and now I am working on these volumes, rebinding and restoring them. At least it gives me the satisfaction to know that I am also working for the United States Army.

I will let you know as soon as I have Volume III ready, and if it should be possible for you to send me the missing picture, I will be glad to insert it in its proper place.
