Please excuse the long delay in answering your letter of January 2nd, for which I can offer no excuse except the fact that we have been terribly busy.

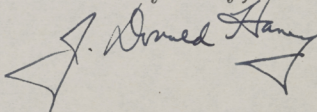
You ask about why the initial payment from the Blancs was \$2363.25 instead of a full \$2500.00. According to the statement furnished by Mildred Shaw Campbell on August 25, 1942, the total purchase price was \$6500.00. \$100.00 had already been paid as a cash deposit, \$2363.25 was paid by check, \$4,000.00 was paid by a promissory note and Trust Deed and the balance of \$36.75 was your share of the 1941 taxes, pro-rated to the date of sale. These figures add up to \$6500.00, and I believe answers your question.

In regard to my brother's wedding pictures, I left certain proofs of the pictures at your old studio just a few days after you left, with a soldier who was apparently in charge. I instructed him to forward the proofs to you, and I marked on the back of each proof in pencil, the number of pictures to be made of each. If you will look on the back of the proofs I believe you will find the pencil numbers.

In regard to the pictures which you took of my family, I am wondering if it would be possible for you to make another print of the picture of Mrs. Haney and the two children. You have already sent us several of these, but I should like very much to have one measuring 4 x 6 inches so that it will fit a frame which I now have in the office. If this is possible, will you please send it to me, together with the wedding pictures.
