Dear Mr. Shabrough:-

While in Colorado a month ago,
I was not able to see you but did see your
representative at Paradise Lodge. I also saw
Mr. Hines of Grace Church and from what I
saw, your stock is at present grazing on
a considerable part of the church property. Owing
to the war & the fact that Bishop Kennedy &
I have both been away, there has been un-
certainty regarding the property lines. I have
just received a duplicate blue print which
~~will show~~ where the fence will have to be
built. I understand from Miss Foster that
you agreed to build this fence as part of the
^{pastor's} ~~pastor's~~ ^{pasture} ~~pasture~~ ^{land}. As you see the line runs
for the corner of the cemetery zig-zagging up the
little valley where the ~~old~~ road goes and up the hill
until it hits the corner. We want a wire gate
where the ^{drive} road turns ^{off} ~~up~~ ^{to go over} ~~to go~~ over the hill -

at present that is our only entrance. While
we were up there - we were much shocked to
find the condition of our cabin. We had it
boarded up while I was there. I have just
had a letter from Mr. Bradshaw, the forest ranger
who tells me that it has been broken into again
& by a horseback party. If this could have
been a party from your Lodge - I trust that
you will see that it does not happen again.
We intend to fix up the cabin when it is possible
but in the mean time I trust that it will not
be legally necessary to turn to the law for its
protection & that we may rely on you to help us.
