Dear Miss Gilpin:

Since we were not at all satisfied with the prints you took with you Tuesday afternoon, we continued balancing the dyes on Wednesday morning and feel that we have much improved the print quality. In addition we made another set of matrices of the flower shot cutting the exposure time from 180 to 140 seconds with greatly improved results.

As you probably would guess, the color balance of the flower scene is extremely critical but we feel the enclosed prints are as close a match for the Kodachrome as you are apt to get with any reasonable amount of work.

Mr. Pinckney did not return until Friday morning so we have not been able to start work on the 11 x 14 prints. We would like to request your permission to allow us to keep the transparencies for the balance of next week.

We hope to include the 11 x 14 prints of your transparencies in our traveling Pan Chroma display and would appreciate your suggestions as to titling so that your credit line may be correct in all respects.
