Dear Miss Gilpin:

Mr. Haney received your letter of recent date but he is out of town and I am answering it on his behalf.

We now have started the estate of Elizabeth Forster, Mental Incompetent, and we are ready to give a Deed to Mr. Haigler's client as soon as the abstracts have been approved by their attorney. The abstract is being examined by John Young for the purchaser at the present time, and he has indicated that there may be some defect in the abstract, but wants more time to consider same.

Enclosed please find a copy of a letter from Bishop Kennedy, inquiring as to whether the property to be sold to him has the spring on it, and the position of the property in regard to the present piece owned by him. I believe that I could make a rough sketch of the property, but I cannot advise him as to the spring, and cannot find anyone in Colorado Springs who knows about it. Please advise us by return mail concerning the spring, and the general direction of the property that we plan to sell to Rev. Kennedy in relation to that now owned by him.
