Dear Miss Gilpin:-

Today we finally retrieved the twenty-one transparencies from the Color Laboratory. We took the liberty of examining them and I think that you will find you have several fine shots, although quite a few of them do have an excess of blue which could be corrected with the addition of your new UV-17 filter.

We have checked with the Phototechnical Laboratory and you can use tungsten film for outdoor pictures if you use the #11 conversion filter. This filter incorporates a certain amount of ultraviolet absorbing characteristics and it is not necessary to add the UV-16 filter to correct for haze. Since the publication of the pamphlet on filters, we have found that when the #11 conversion filter is used, it is not necessary to increase the exposure.

AnSCO does not market a processing thermometer, but we can recommend to you a Taylor Etched Thermometer #21870 which is a 6" pocket type thermometer from 0 to 120 F, or the #21850 which reads from 60 to 100 F. These can be obtained from the Taylor Instrument Company, Rochester, New York.
