Dear Mr. Daniel:-

May I please have returned to me the negatives I sent you a few weeks ago from San Antonio of Yucatan. Several of these I shall be needing almost immediately as I am getting to work on the Yucatan book and I included several that I shall probably use for it.

Recently I had a letter from Mr. L.S. Williams of HOLIDAY inclosing the three Kodachromes I sent to Mr. Beaman some weeks ago. In his letter he states that they are planning an article on Chichen Itza and saying that if I have covered that area with color shots he would like to see them. I presume that my letter to Mr. Beaman was separated from the Kodachromes for these of-course were of Chichen Itza. I have answered his letter explaining the matter and also telling him that you had prints of Chichen and other points in Yucatan.

Unless you feel that you need them, I should also like to have returned the pages I

left with you last spring from my BOEING books. These prints are the only ones I have and constitute my record of my war job and I should like to get the books put together again. Those negatives of-course do not belong to me and I cannot duplicate them. As the possibility of any work for me in industrial work seems remote at the present time I should like these prints returned. The others I left with you I do not need. The Boeing prints were mounted on 11x14 pages punched for spiral binding so they should be easily identified.

My new work room will be ready for use this week and I shall be getting to work on much printing which is waiting to be done.
