Dear Mr. Williams:-

Your letter of April 2 together with the three Kodachromes which I had sent to Mr. Beeman, finally reached me after following me around for several weeks. I am wondering if you saw the letter I sent in with the Kodachromes for those were shots of Chichen Itza which you returned to me. Also through my agent PLX, Inc., you were to receive a number of black and white prints made at Chichen Itza and in Yucatan. I am at work on a book of Chichen which ill be published by Hawnings House in the near future, and when down to complete the series which I commenced twelve years ago.

Owing to the difficulties of heat and also the difficulty in obtaining Kodachrome when I was there two months ago I made only a few color shots and then three which I sent in to you are unpublished. Two of them were the ruins of Chichen Itza and the third the old Spanish Church which is adjacent to the ruins. As titles were not attached to the transparencies you may not have had the information that these

Kodachromes are the region you are interested in.

I am now located in Santa Fe where I am working on the completion of two books. Should you wish me to submit anything from this area I shall be very glad to do so at any time.
