USE

Mix one part of A two parts of B Ten parts of water

Put print into solution for from 4 to 15 seconds and then wash very thoroly.

Put the print in <u>dry</u> if you wish the bleach to affect <u>only the highlights</u>

Put the print in wet if you wish the bleach to penetrate the middle values.

So sayth Ansel Adams who sometimes puts only part of a print into the bleach, moving it slightly to avoid a line. Or puts a print into the bleach, wiggles it around and then dumps it into the wash water saying, "There, that's better" when I can't see a bit of difference. But when the treated print is dry and put along side the eriginal print, then I can see that there is comparison
