Dear Mr. Hagberg:-

Dr. Johnson of the Indian Hospital in Santa Fe, and Miss Elinor Gregg have suggested that I see you about the possibility of doing field nursing in the Indian Pueblos.

I am a graduate nurse, registered in Colorado, and have had a rather varied experience in this type of work. For twelve years, I was supervisor of the Visiting Nurse Association in Colorado Springs--was with the Red Cross Town and Country Nursing Service for two years--supervised the E.N.A. County Nursing Projects throughout the State of Colorado in 1934-35 and have had two years as field nurse for the National Association of Indian Affairs on the Navajo Reservation.

Three years ago I had a very severe illness and have done no nursing until last August when I accepted a position as head nurse in a small T.B. Sanatorium in Colorado Springs. As my interest lies in Public Health nursing, I have recently returned to Santa Fe with the hope of finding a position of this sort.

I shall be glad to come to Albuquerque to see you at your convenience and furnish any further information and references as you may require.
