Ox10 kodachrome, and two small ones. The large, is
the living room of the residence of Mrs. Arthur
Cable at Pojuague, New Mexico. Recently, I made a
series of black and white photographs of her house
for her, and while I was making these, this room had
such an appeal in color and presented such an interesting
problem in light, that I could not resist trying it.
The two small kodachromes are garden things I made
some years ago but have never submitted. The outdoor
one is the garden of Kathleen Marriage, noted gardener
of Colorado Springs, Colorado.

Some years ago, I had a number of Southwest pictures
in VOGUE, but I cannot recall the moment if I have
ever had anything in HOUSE & GARDEN. My records are
still in storage in Colorado which used to be my home.
I left there to fill a position as public relations
photographer at the B 29 Boeing Plant at Wichita, Kansas,
during the war. Since then I have been working on two
new books, one of which is due off the press at any time
now. EXILES IN YUCATAN, Hastings House, is this book,
and a much more ambitious one will be out next fall, by
Duell, Sloan & Pearce. Now that these books are finished,
I am ready for other work and should like very much to
do work for you in this western region. Santa Fe is now
my permanent headquarters, and I could cover quite a
territory from here. Would you consider anything of the
residence of Habel Lujan at Taos? Now that her new book
is out, it would be pertinent.

Should you wish to see other examples of my black &
white work, I shall be pleased to send some on to you at
once.
