Dear Miss Gilpin:

I have been trying to locate some negatives that were made at the J. R. Bradley Ranch some years ago. We have an album made up of several of Mr. Standley's photographs and some that were added later. After considerable searching around town, I finally found out from Mr. Woodruff (Stewart's) that they were probably made by you. He has copy negatives of them made for postcards. Naturally knowing who the photographers were made by, we hesitate to copy them and Woodruff does not want to sell us prints without your permission. The story is that the Wild Rose Camp has been sold and is being made into a dude ranch. the Photographs are being used in advertising pamphlets and used for publicity purposes. The particular one of yours that I am writing about is to be sent to the United Airlines for some sort of publicity.

I shall try to describe it for you. It is titled "The Card Room". The scene shows a large fireplace with fire on the ~~left~~^{right} and has a large moose head mounted over it. On the ~~right~~^{left} is a small bar with a small sign reading clearly, Bar Now ~~Open~~^{Open}. In the foreground left is the end of a rustic couch with a navajo blanket cover and a lighted bridge lamp and the end. Center fore is a rustic armchair and a hexagonal low table between it and a similar chair. I believe this description will distinguish it from another similar shot made from an angle more to the right and showing a small flight of stairs to the right of the fireplace.

They desire an 8x10 glossy print of this negative and are, of course in a big rush. If you could supply us the print or give us your permission to enlarge the post card negative, we would be most appreciative and will reimburse you for your trouble. Our usual charge for this type of work is 1.00 for reprints from their own negatives or 3.00 for reprints from our stock negatives. Whatever your charge is, we will charge them, and in turn pay you.
