Gentlemen:-

My apolog is certainly due you for not writing long ago regarding my accout. I assumed that the charge for these books would be placed on my account with Duell, Sloan & Pearce, Inc. and it was only when my check came in just before Christmas that I found that this had not been deducted. I enclose herewith my check for this amount, \$22.28 and an additional \$12.50 for three more copies of my book. I have no copies on hand at present and there are occasions when I need to send one for some special purpose.

I hope the sales from Wichita Kansas were satisfactory. During the exhibition of my original photographs in that city, the Wichita Art Association requested me to give a talk. Had we had more books available they would have sold immedistely for the twenty six copies we did have were gone the day of the opening of the exhibition and at least a dozen more were ordered. At any future showings of the prints I shall personally see that sufficient copies are on hand.

Perhaps I do not understand sufficiently the relationship between your company and Duell, Sloan & Pearce. I regret the delay in the payment on this enclosed account, but I fully expected it to be charged against my royalty account.
