requirements under State law; and

- (4) traveling or city salesmen generally, engaged upon a full-time basis for their principals (except for side-line sales activities on behalf of another person).

NOTE.—The income of an employee over the age of 18 from the sale of newspapers or magazines to an ultimate consumer is subject to the self-employment tax if the income consists of retained profits from such sales.

5. Real estate rentals.—Rentals from real estate, except rentals received in the course of a trade or business as a real estate dealer. Payments for the use or occupancy of rooms or other space where services are also rendered to the occupant, such as rooms in hotels, boarding houses, apartment houses furnishing hotel services, tourist camps, tourist homes, or space in parking lots, warehouses, or storage garages do not constitute rentals from real estate and therefore are included in determining net earnings from self-employment;

6. Interest and dividends.—Dividends on shares of stock, and interest on bonds, debentures, notes, certificates, or other evidences of indebtedness, issued with interest coupons or in registered form

and community property laws.

In computing his aggregate net earnings from self-employment, a partner should include his entire share of such earnings from a partnership. No part of that share may be attributed to the partner's wife (or husband) even though the income may, under State law, be community income.

SCHEDULE C-a (Form 1040)

To assure proper credit to your account, be sure to enter your name and social security account number on Schedule C-a (Form 1040) exactly as they are shown on your social security card. If you do not have a social security account number, you must get one in time to enable you to file your return on or before the due date. These account numbers are obtainable from any of the approximately 500 Social Security Administration Field Offices throughout the country. The telephone directory or your local post office will give you the address. Do not delay filing your return beyond the due date even though you have not obtained your social security account number.

Regardless of whether a joint or separate returns on Form 1040 are filed by husband and wife, Schedule C-a (Form 1040) should show only the name of the one with the self-employment income.

REQUEST FOR YOUR SOCIAL SECURITY ACCOUNT NUMBER (Self-Employment Income)

Enclosed is the original or a photocopy of your Schedule C-a (U.S. Report of Self-Employment Income) which does not show your social security account number. In order that we can associate your self-employment income report with your social security account, please follow the instructions below.

If you HAVE a social security account number card, enter your number exactly as shown on your card, in the space provided on the Schedule C-a. If that space already contains information, enter your account number above the space. If the name on the Schedule C-a is different from that shown on your card, enter the name as shown on your card below the address box on the Schedule C-a. Return only the completed Schedule C-a.

If you DO NOT HAVE a social security card because you lost it or never received one, complete and sign the enclosed Form SS-5 (Application for Social Security Account Number). Return the Schedule C-a together with the completed Form SS-5. A social security card will be sent to you.

An envelope which requires no postage is enclosed for your use in replying.

PROMPT ACTION IS NECESSARY

Be sure to show your account number and name exactly as shown on your account number card on all future self-employment income tax returns and correspondence regarding such returns.

Gentlemen:-

A few weeks ago I received a new Social Security Number from your office. I had requested this through the local office as I had had my hand bag stoled with all my identification papers including my former Number.

In with the new number you have issued me, No. 515-20-1326 was the enclosed form which I presume you wish filledout. I have put the new number in pencil in case there should be any change. Somewhere among my papers I have a record of my old number but I have not been able to find it.

The first number was issued to me during the war when I was employed at the Boeing Airplane Company in Wichita Kansas. I began work there late in November of 1942 and left there early in 1945. If you wish me to find my old number perhaps I could find it from the Boeing Company. Or perhaps you have a complete record of their employees.

Is the sum of \$419.67 The amount from the war years at boeing or had an amount been added to my account here in Santa Fe through my income tax report? I am anxious to get the whole matter straightened out and to know the correct figures.
