If my plans mature as I hope, I shall be in the East before that date and will surely come to Washington.

About the color slides, I do not mean to show them in a light box, but only by projection. It begins to look as though I am being booked for a number of "lectures" on the Navaho. Yes, I am doing this professionally. I have so much invested in all this, that I must earn my way out so to speak. I have shown the slides with the talk twice to groups of 100 people for \$50. The one here in Santa Fe to a larger audience for \$75. Yours I am sure would come under the smaller group. I hope by the coming spring to have a really good projector of my own. It is of the utmost importance to have one, as color slides can be easily damaged by an inadequate one which gets too hot.

Keep the clippings if you wish. If there is any further information that you need, I shall be glad to send to it. I am off in about ten days for another trip into the Navaho country which I hope will just about wind up the field work on the book, and give me more exhibition material.
