If Carol Preston has listed my appearance at the Potomac School as a "lecture", it is a little misleading as the talk is incidental to my series of color slides. So you see it probably means an evening affair. I shall have my own projector as my slides are all standard size, not 35mm. I imagine that you have an adequate screen at the school.
