## THE STATEMENT

IT IS VERY DIFFICULT TO FIND ANY <u>ONE</u> THING TO SAY TO A HOUSEWIFE ABOUT THE ENVIRONMENT OF THE HOME THAT WILL NOT AT SOME STAGE DISINTEGRATE INTO IVY IN THE TEA KETTLE OR LAMPS MADE OF SPINNING WHEELS.

I COME TO THE CONCLUSION THAT THE BEST ONE CAN DO IS WISH FOR THE HOUSEWIFE EITHER GREAT LOVE OR PROFOUND DISCIPLINE, OR AN EQUIVALENT COMBINATION OF BOTH.

IN TERMS OF ENVIRONMENT, NEITHER LOVE NOR DISCIPLINE ARE EASY TO COME BY THESE DAYS. "THINGS" ARE, AS A RULE, TOO PLENTIFUL, AND QUALITY TOO CASUAL, TO ENCOURAGE LOVE; THEY ARE TOO VARIED AND UNRESTRAINED TO PROMOTE DISCIPLINE.

## THE EXAMPLE

WE MIGHT HAVE USED AS AN EXAMPLE AN OLD HOUSE FROM THE EAST COAST OR THE SOUTH, BUT THIS COULD EASILY SUGGEST STYLE, WHICH I CERTAINLY HAVE NOT IN MIND.
