LODGING

Hotels and motels in Santa Fe will give those attending the Mountain-Plains Museum Conference a wide range in price and comfort from which to choose. A complete list of accommodations is not enclosed; instead, a selected group of hotels located within a few blocks of the downtown units of the Museum of New Mexico is listed below. This will place the conferees in the center of Santa Fe within walking distance of the Palace of the Governors, Hall of Ethnology, and the Art Gallery as well as banks, post office, shops, parking areas, and points of interest.

A considerable number of motels are located on the south side of Santa Fe on Cerrillos Road (U.S. Highway 85). Motel rates are approximately those of a medium-priced hotel. Generally, accommodations may be found without advance reservations.
